

17 17, Amelia Street: A minimalist garden which nevertheless contains a wide variety of vibrant plants, flowers and trees. Tea, coffee and juice (plus a biscuit or two) for sale and face painting for anyone of any age. Sculptures by Michael Kusz. Accessed down the ginnel between Edward and Amelia Street.

18 2, Albert Avenue: Visit this large, colourful, 1936 end-of-village garden. Hollyhocks, cosmos and rudbekias are a feature of late summer with trees, birds, flowers and shrubs all year round. Places to sit and a game for children.

19 16, Dallam Avenue: Shiatsu massage as well as a south-facing gravel front garden and a cooler and greener space at the rear. Sculptures by Darrel Evanes.

20 23, Constance Street: Celebrating the life that once was, there is a tree lightly decorated in light. Old wooden guttering was planted in 2013 with succulents, herbs and flowers. This family home creates space in a limited area. Sculptures by Salma Patel.

21 15, Albert Road: Back yard with planting established in the last seven years, including many plants in containers, together with a small front garden with a variety of shrubs. Sculptures by Rachel Carter.

22 21, Albert Road: Established over six years, this garden makes the most of the variety of levels with shrubs and perennials as well as pots. Sculptures by Cameron Hopkins.

23 37 and 39, Albert Road: Vintage clothes and artefacts at number 37, whilst Frock-a-hula's exclusive vintage shop at number 39 offers fine frockery and accessories, divine crockery and homewares.

24 Hirst Wood Nature Reserve, Hirst Lane: A community nature reserve, with wildflower sowing, pond with dipping platform, seating, stepping stones to wetland and 30 ornamental trees of different shapes and sizes. Grand opening on 12 September from 13:00.

## Open Gardens, Sculpture Trail and Pop Up Events

All events are from 12.00 - 16.30 on Saturday 12 and Sunday 13 September unless otherwise stated.

Access to houses and gardens is often via one or two steps. Please take care as paving may be slippery and please be patient as some houses and back yards will accommodate only a few visitors at a time.

- Follow yellow for fairs and performances
- Follow purple for pop up events
- Follow green for open gardens

**6** Canalside Allotments: World Heritage allotment gardens in an idyllic setting with vegetables, fruit, flowers and bees. A sustainable site featured in 'My Cool Allotment' by Lia Leendertz. Refreshments and produce for sale.

**7** 43, Rhodes Street: Courtyard style garden with mixed planting, bright colour and year-round interest. Much use is made of salvaged items including a new seating area made of pallets.

**8** 26, Rhodes Street: Maree creates life-like representations of animals, wildlife and people in pastels and welcomes commissions. Colin specialises in Saltaire during WW1. See what life was like in Saltaire during the war.

**9** Caroline Street Car Park: Veg on the Edge's Sunday School Garden maintained by community gardeners.

**10** 4, William Henry Street: Forever Aloe Vera products for health and skincare, based on fresh potent aloe vera. Product samples and possibly tea, coffee and cakes.

**11** 47, George Street: The owner has brought a French influence from her home country to this back yard. Sculptures by Helen Moreton.

**12** 17, George Street: Container garden in its second year. Planting around the outside of the yard leaves space for socialising with friends and family. Sculptures by Simon Reed.

**13** 72, George Street: 'Yardfest' open back yard with live acoustic music every hour. Day one will be a range of local original music; day two jazz and blues. Accessed from Upper Ada Street.

**14** Wash House Garden: This community garden is on the site of the former village wash house. Herbs to share and a new bench for relaxation.

**15** 19, Ada Street: Developed over nine years, this formal garden has a country feel. Key features are colour and structure with small pots, larger specimens and comfortable seating. Teas and cakes for sale (weather dependent). Saltaire-themed laser cuts and screen prints as well as garden planters for sale. Sculptures by Sarah McDade.

**16** 43, Ada Street: The Jolly Brew Coffee Co provides freshly roasted coffee from Saltaire, eat in or take out. Tea and cake available as well.
